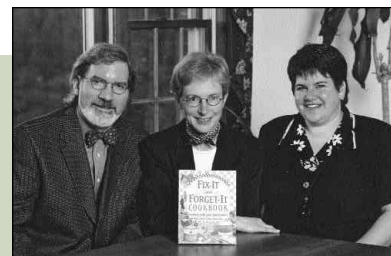
J. David Lehman (C 78) of Los Angeles was recently appointed to chair the history department at Long Beach City College.

America's best-selling cookbook

Three EMU alumni made up the team that produced America's best-selling cookbook in 2001. The book was published by Good Books of Intercourse, Pa.

The book, titled *Fix-It and Forget-It Cookbook: Feasting With Your Slow Cooker*, has outsold all other cookbooks, including those by Betty Crocker, Martha Stewart and *Better Homes & Gardens*. In early March, it also reached 2nd place on the *New York Times* best-seller list in the category of "Advice, How-To and Miscellaneous," paperback. The book sold 630,000 copies as of Feb. 28.

"Slow cookers are a way of survival for working people," explained Ranck. "They have a hot, nutritious and fairly inexpensive meal all ready to eat when they come home."

Why the success of this particular book? "The title has appeal to customers," said Phyllis. "Also, most slow-cooker books have only 100 or 200 recipes, whereas this one has more than 800—and they are really tasty and easy to prepare."
