Second Degree Option

Prerequisites: Anatomy & Physiology, Course with Chemistry Content (organic, inorganic, biochemistry)

Part-time study is available. Evening classes are not available in the second degree option.

Clinical experiences are Tuesday and Thursday mornings the first semester and 6:45-3:00 p.m. on Tuesday and Thursdays for most of the remaining semesters. There are selected evening clinical experiences.

Most nursing classes are Monday, Wednesday and Friday at 9:00, 10:40 a.m. and 1:40-4:30 p.m.

The nursing major may be entered in August or January.

A **2.8** GPA is required for entering the Clinical Level.

Apply for Level One (clinical level) for August admission by February 15 and for January admission by June 1.

Courses such as psychology, sociology, chemistry, anatomy & physiology and the cross-cultural courses may be transferred from your original degree program if they were already completed. In order to graduate from EMU the student must have completed at least one course in the arts and humanities at the college level (SACS requirement). A student whose first language is other than English may, upon assessment, be required to complete a course in Writing or Speech. Each applicant's course record will be reviewed individually.
